## **Today's Audition**

Because the turnout for our summer musical auditions is traditionally very strong, it's likely that we'll be moving people through the process quickly. However, we are dedicated to giving everyone a chance to show off their skills.

We will be auditioning in small groups. Here's what you can expect:

First off is the singing and acting audition. We'll begin with a group sing on part of "Lullaby of Broadway." Then, each auditionee will be asked to sing solo using the song recommended for the part you're most interested in.

For the acting section, everyone will read two short dialogue scenes. The first will be a role and scene of your choosing. In the second scene, we'll be asking you to read opposite someone else's dialogue scene so it may (or may not) be a part you are interested in playing.

Second, the audition group will be directed to the dance audition in a separate room. Our choreographer and her assistants will teach you a short routine before having you dance through it. Depending on turnout, you may be participating in the dance audition first.

We hope that the entire audition process will take no longer than an hour. Once you've completed both parts, you're free to go.
